



## Turning the Corner on Another Year!

As MIT enters the final weeks of the 2012-13 school year, it is tempting to think of it as the “homestretch.” But a better metaphor would be “turning the corner” – with 2012-13 on one side and 2013-14 on the other – which more correctly implies continuous movement from one phase to another. On the 2012-13 side we have the conclusion of a record-setting school year that included the following:

- Concluding the year with our highest end-of-year enrollment ever (776), along with a 98% re-enrollment rate for next year;
- Record-setting performances for the California Exit Exam (pass rates of 91% for math and 92% for English) as well as record numbers of students on the honor roll (especially at the middle school!);
- Successful new RTI programs for end-of-block, end-of-day, and “ban-the-zero” academic recovery.

And turning the corner to the 2013-14 school year, there is much to look forward to:

- More “alternate pathway” choices for students, including an expanded independent study program and more computer “distance-learning” courses.
- Expanded tutoring and mentoring programs;
- More advanced electives, including advanced placement Calculus, Spanish, and Chinese.
- A focus on the new Common Core Standards being rolled out nationally in 2014-15.

Sometimes turning a corner leaves one great view behind but reveals an even better view ahead, and a whole new vista of possibilities!

## Here Comes Summer School!

As in the past, MIT will be offering a full summer school program this year, for incoming 6<sup>th</sup> graders through exiting 12<sup>th</sup> graders. Also as in the past, we will again be offering “catch up” courses in the core subject areas (math, science, English and Social Science), as well as expanded incoming 6<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> grade programs. Check out these summer offerings:

- *Academic Support / Credit Recovery*, various middle and high school classes to support math and English deficits. Runs 6/24–7/19 (see schedules below).
- *Blended Learning*, an educational program in which high school students can make up failed coursework online with help from an instructor. Runs 6/24–7/19 with both morning and afternoon sessions (see schedules below).
- *Bridges to High School*, incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders and high school students new to MIT can take health and geography to get a jump on high school and complete 10 credits during the summer. Both sessions recommended. Runs 6/24–7/19 (see schedules below).
- *6<sup>th</sup> Grade Jumpstart*, a four-day fun and engaging introduction to MIT that stresses MIT orientation, basic technology skills, and team-building. Runs 8/5–8/8 from 8:30–2:00.

Fifty-four hard working young adults will have their final ceremony welcoming them to adulthood as they graduate and walk the stage on Thursday, June 13<sup>th</sup>, 2013, at Touro University's Landers Hall. These amazing young adults have done much more than the “average” high school graduate in that, in addition to earning at least 230 credits, they have fulfilled the UC “A-G” requirements, completed 140 hours of community service, a 40 hour internship, 9 college credits, and earned their way to Washington DC for the ultimate school project and fieldtrip!

Each graduate will receive 8 tickets for “VIP seating” (on the lower level); however, there is lots of quality seating on the ample second level – so all are invited and all are welcome!

## DC a Smashing Success!

The “jewel in the crown” for MIT's project-based learning philosophy is the senior trip to Washington DC, which is the culminating activity for the senior government class. Seniors worked tirelessly throughout the year to earn the \$40,000 to take 47 students and chaperones to Washington for a week. Thanks to coordinators Ryan Cole and Aubrey Perry, along with Board of Directors VP Lynne Vaughn, the trip was a complete success and the kids came back emboldened by their knowledge and full of stories to tell (many of which *will* be told at graduation on June 13<sup>th</sup>!).

2012–2013 also provided proof that MIT's new fundraising structure, in which each class is responsible for earning its own way to DC, can and will work for current and future classes. Indeed, *next* year's class (Class of 2014) has already earned \$15,000 towards their DC goal, and their fundraising efforts are going strong! Good thing, too, because the class of 2014 is over 70 students – MIT's largest ever – so they'll need all the support they can get – so don't hesitate to jump right in and begin supporting them now!
