BLACK HISTORY MONTH:

We are proud to feed your mind one day at a time for Black History Month. Your daily dose of history for today is: On February 26th:

The Black Panthers, also known as the Black Panther Party, was a political organization founded in 1966 by Huey Newton and Bobby Seale to challenge police brutality against the African American community. The Black Panthers' early activities primarily involved monitoring police activities in black communities in Oakland and other cities.

COLOR-GUARD COMPETITION:

Last Saturday, students Xareni Ortega and Josseline Rivera used a robot to clean and do water quality testing at Lake Dalwick. They pulled out tires, wigs and 30 bags of trash while working side by side with Vallejo Watershed Alliance, the US Forest Service, citizen scientists and the Sierra Club. Their mechanical mentor pulled water samples which we tested in the classroom. If you are interested in a citizen science program that monitors the coastal ecosystems of California and learn the way to use robots in real life check out MIT ASP robotics. . We monitor ecosystems and aim to provide publicly accessible, scientifically sound, long-term data to inform marine resource management and the scientific community of our findings.
